From Rev'd Warren Watson's Desk



'Lead Like Jesus'

Ken Blanchard, wrote a book on leadership called *The One Minute Manager* that has sold over 13 millions copies. After his success Blanchard began to think about God. He went straight to the Gospels. He wanted to know who Jesus was and what Jesus did. Blanchard was blown away by the way Jesus transformed twelve ordinary people into the first generation of leaders of a movement that affected the course of world history over 2,000 years. Blanchard saw that everything he had ever written about effective leadership, Jesus had already done so much better than he could. Jesus gives a great leadership model to follow, be it spiritual or secular. When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on his final journey in Matthew 21 v 1-17, there are three characteristics to help us all to 'Lead like Jesus.'

- 1. Lead from who you are more than your position, verse 3. Jesus' authority didn't come from having a high position in some hierarchy. It simply came from who he was as a person. Jesus never had to make threats or promises. Be who you are, comfortable in your own skin, a beloved and special child of God.
- 2. Be gentle and unassuming verse 5. The word used about Jesus in verse 5 is 'Gentle.' In the original Greek the word means 'considerate, unassuming.' It is the opposite of aggressive or self-seeking. This is not a characteristic of leadership that the world expects yet it is attractive and powerful.
- 3. Make prayer your number one priority verse 13. Jesus was committed and passionate about prayer. Throughout the Gospels we read about Jesus withdrawing to quiet places to be on his own with God. This was the source of his strength.

Footnote and prayer: In a few weeks there will be a general election. We are urged to pray: 'I urge you, first of all, to pray for all people. Ask God to help them; intercede on their behalf, and give thanks for them. Pray this way for kings and all who are in authority so that we can live peaceful and quiet lives marked by godliness and dignity.' 1 Timothy 2:1-2.

And a prayer to pray: "Father, we lift our leaders up to you today. Draw them close to Yourself, Your wisdom and Your ways through Your grace. We ask that You would help them in making decisions that align with what You would like to accomplish in Your will and Your plan. Amen."


